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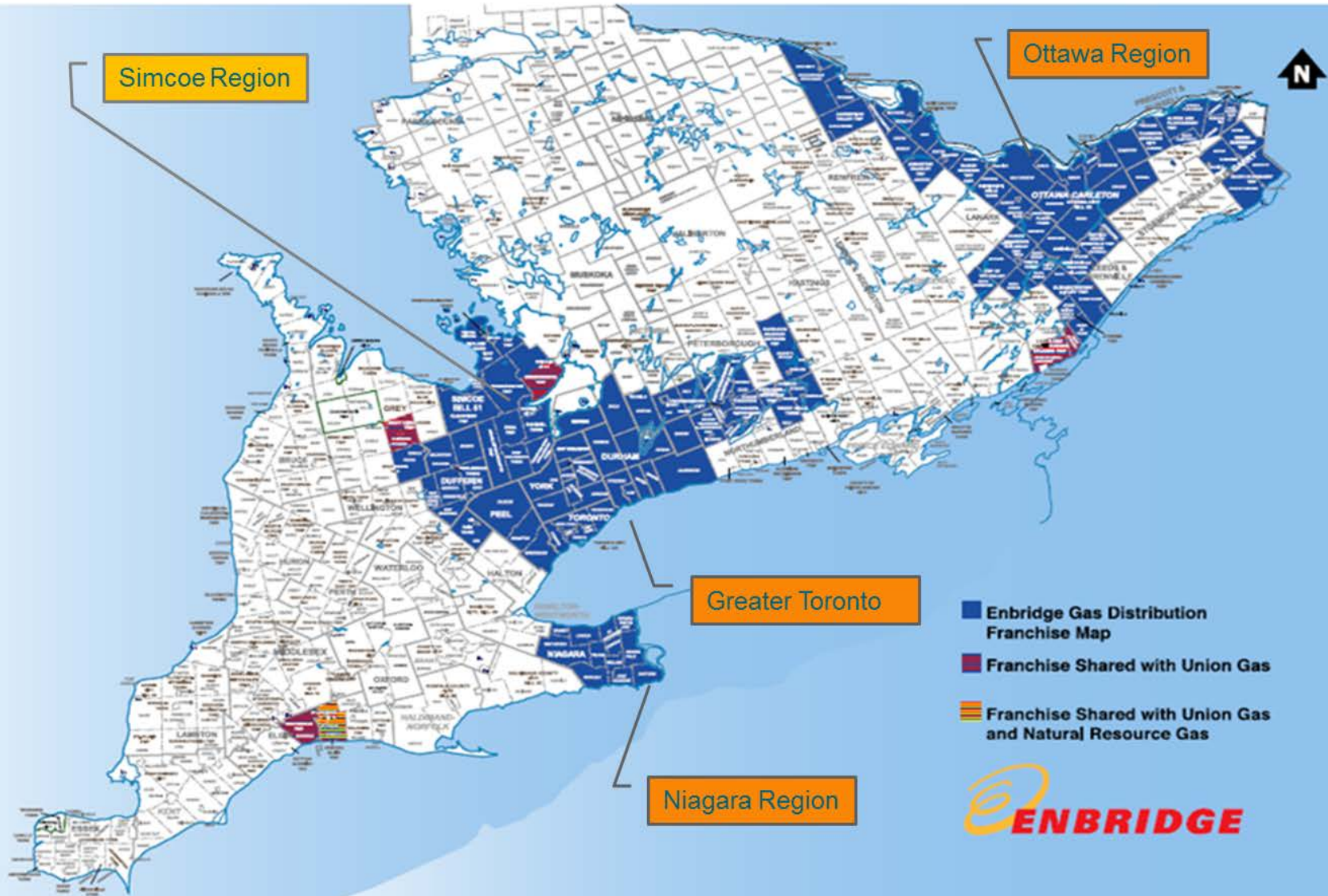

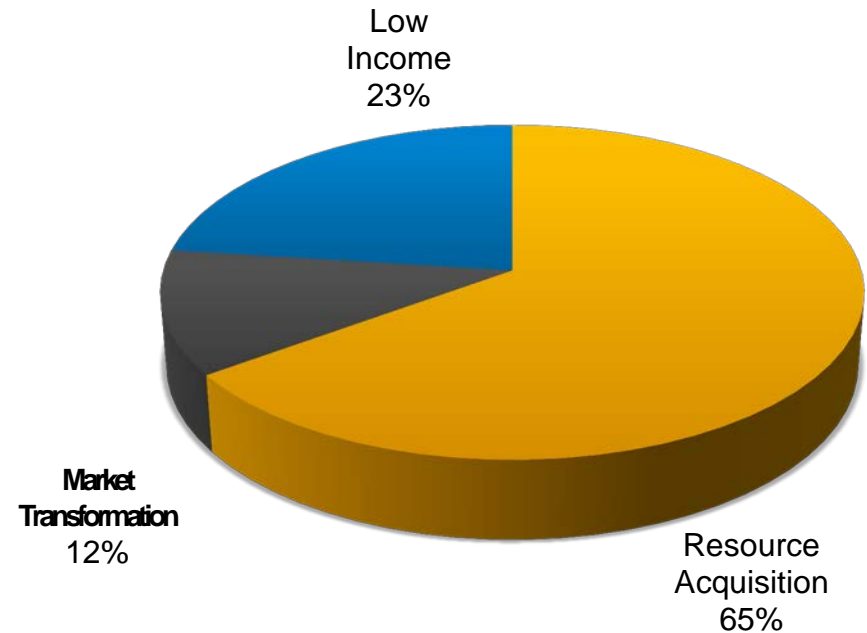
About Enbridge



Enbridge Program Plan Overview (DSM Plan 2016-2020)

- OEB approved DSM Plan to 2020
- Balanced Scorecard approach
- Mid-term review in 2017.
 - ▶ Target completion date of review: June 1, 2018.
- Low Income Program
 - ▶ Home Winterproofing Program
 - ▶ Part 3 Multiresidential Buildings
 - ▶ Affordable Housing New Construction
 - ▶ 23% of total program budget

Program Details

- Pre and post home energy audit
- Measures: attic, wall, and basement insulation, air sealing, draft proofing
- Heat reflector panels
- Showerheads, kitchen and bathroom aerators
- Programmable thermostats
- Carbon monoxide detectors

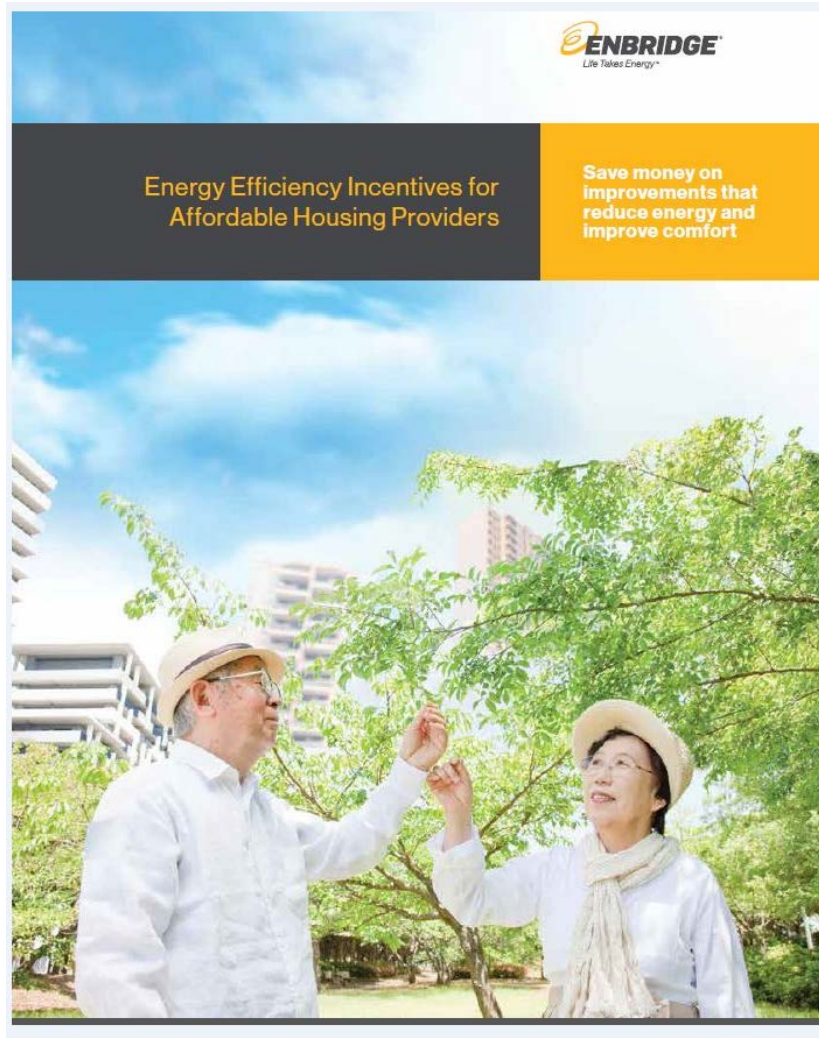


Home Winterproofing Program

Affordable Housing Program for Multiresidential Buildings



Program Offer

- Building assessment
- Enhanced financial incentives for capital upgrades and/or replacements
- Direct install for in-suite measures
- Energy audit subsidy
- Resident engagement

Target Customer

- Building owners and property managers of multiresidential buildings, generally defined as OBC Part 3
- Social and assisted housing
- Non profits and co-ops
- Shelters and supportive housing
- Income qualified buildings located at census defined and municipally informed priority needs neighborhoods

New Construction - Affordable Housing



Program Description

Provides affordable housing builders and developers with incentives and services to encourage the construction, renovation and rehabilitation of high-performing, energy efficient affordable housing buildings. Municipalities and affordable housing networks will be engaged to promote

Target Customer

- Developers & builders of new construction affordable housing projects – single/ multi-res buildings
- Municipal service managers
- Affordable housing providers

Program Offer

- Financial incentives to exceed building code requirements by minimum 15%
- Energy modelling, technical and building design support
- Work with municipal housing managers, planners, developers, builders & construction trade

Program Rationale

Prevents lost opportunities (EB-2014-0134) and promotes sustainable affordable housing.

- *“Regeneration/Redevelopment”. Preservation of social housing assets while creating new affordable housing communities.*
- *Leverages long term sustainability and affordable housing municipal plans and targets.*
- *Promotes housing affordability: reduce energy operating costs for residents and/or housing providers.*
- *External policy drivers: energy, housing, environmental, poverty, health*
